Write a 1,000-1,500 word statement of your personal goals in ministry. Include a self-assessment describing the experiences that led you to set these goals, as well as your future potential for meeting them.

4. Applicants from faith traditions other than Christian

If you belong to a faith tradition other than a Christian denomination, describe why you choose to study on this academic level in this interfaith context. Since many of your colleagues will be reflecting out of a Christian perspective, describe how prepared you are both to enter and influence that context.

English Language Proficiency

English proficiency is required for entrance into this program. This English Language proficiency requirement can be met in one of 4 ways: 1) the TOEFL exam with an Internet total score of 80 [213 computer, 550 paper], with a 20 minimum in four sections of reading, listening, speaking and writing; 2) An undergraduate or graduate degree from an institution in which English was the instructional language; 3) 4 semesters of ESL from an accredited institution, or 4) A documentable exemption from the above, e.g., extensive ministerial experience in an English speaking context, a bilingual family of origin where English was one of the domestic languages, extensive education instruction apart from college or university in English (e.g., a British style prep-school), etc.

Transcripts

Transcripts of all post-secondary academic credits should be sent to the Director of the Ecumenical Doctor of Ministry at CTU by the respective institutions.

Recommendations

Three (3) recommendations are required: one from an ecclesiastical superior or religious supervisor who is in a position to evaluate your ministerial experience; one from a person who can evaluate your academic ability; and one from a peer (a colleague in ministry or a friend).
